

Founded in 2010, The Clink Charity runs hospitality training programmes in around a third of UK prisons.

We train approximately 800 people in prison each year, providing them with City & Guilds qualifications and a full Help, Guidance and Rehabilitation service post-release, for as long as our trainees require it.

This approach, coupled with supporting our students into paid employment via our network of employers, is proven to reduce reoffending and help people rebuild their lives.

60% of our students were supported into employment over the past 2 years.

MOJ's 2022 report found that the reoffending rate by the Clink was as much as 50% lower when compared on a like-for-like basis









Clink Events is a premium social enterprise caterer that provides training opportunities for vulnerable adults working in event catering.

Food is prepared in our training kitchens in HMP Downview and Herne Hill by students working towards their City & Guilds NVQ L1,2 &3 in Professional Cookery.

Work opportunities for vulnerable young adults are provided in both our training kitchens and front of house on events through our Institute of Hospitality accredited courses.

71% of total workforce hours are provided by Clink Students

Over 25,000 training hours are delivered each year!

All profits generated from our events are retained by The Clink Charity to help fund our training and support network across the UK.
